I write about a distinguished former student. John Hubbard lived in Teddington while attending your school. He left for I.C. in the early 1950s, thereafter The Atomic Energy Authority, Harwell. At the time of his death in 1980 he was internationally renowned for his work as a theoretical physicist in solid-state physics, and best known for the "Hubbard Hamiltonian" which launched an industry of academic research that is very active to this day.

His standing as a physicist is recognized in the name of a new research institute "The Hubbard Institute" funded by a government grant and based at R.H.C., University of London (see December advertisement in Physics Today).
